2) Hebrews 11 – Read & Word Study/Research

- a) What is a good definition of “faith?” (One properly defined “faith” as rightly reasoned belief. Faith is used in various ways: 1) The faith (i.e., the system of faith), Acts 6:7, Ephesians 4:5, 2) Trust/Belief in God/Christ (i.e., John 8:24, Hebrews 11:6), 3) Etc. Note – True “faith” is connected with obedience, as is clearly shown in this chapter and others [i.e., James 2]; Further, “faith” is NOT a mere blind leap in the dark, rather it is based on correctly reasoned evidence. In other words, while we don’t see God (2 Corinthians 5:7, Hebrews 11:3), we do have faith in Him—we believe/trust—based on evidence—cf., Psalm 19:1ff, Romans 1:20, 1 Thessalonians 5:21. Sadly, many people try to separate true faith/belief from obedience and thus falsely teach the erroneous doctrine of “mere mental ascent.” Yet, true faith/belief (while obviously involving mental ascent), also involves obedience to God—Hebrews 5:9, John 14:15, Romans 6:16-18, etc.)
- b) Who do “the elders” of Hebrews 11:2 reference? (Various Old Testament Heroes, as this chapter goes on to show)
- c) What verse mentions the faithful “Enoch” by name? (Hebrews 11:5)
- d) Referencing God, Hebrews 11:6 tells us, “But without _____ it is impossible to please Him....” (faith)
- e) In what sense did Noah condemn the world (Hebrews 11:7)? (By showing himself faithful, Noah stood as an example of the fact that “it could be done.” In other words, his righteousness left no excuse for those who refused God. Cf., 1 Corinthians 6:2-3, Philippians 1:28)
- f) This chapter says that Abraham was called to another land and that he “...obeyed; and he went out....” What verse is this found in? (Hebrews 11:8)
- g) Sara is also commended in the honor roll of faith. What verse describes her trusted obedience? (Hebrews 11:11-12)
- h) What verse in this chapter speaks of the faith of Jacob when he “...worshipped, leaning upon the top of his staff?” (Hebrews 11:21)
- i) Read Hebrews 11:30. Did their faith save them “before” or “after” they obeyed God? (AFTER; Cf., 2 Kings 5, Acts 2, etc.)
