- c) Referring to keeping God’s commandments, which verse says, “Keep therefore and do them; for this is your wisdom and your understanding...?” (Deuteronomy 4:6)
- d) What verse declares, “but teach them thy sons, and thy sons’ sons?” (Deuteronomy 4:9)
- e) In what verse is Egypt likened unto an “iron furnace?” (Deuteronomy 4:20)
- f) Referencing Israel’s ability to return to God, what verse declares, “But...thou shalt find Him, if thou seek Him with all thy heart and with all thy soul?” (Deuteronomy 4:29)

- e) Deuteronomy 5:29 reads, “O that there were such an _____ in them, that they would _____ Me, and _____ all my commandments always, that it might be _____ with them, and with their children for ever!” (heart; fear; keep; well)

- f) What verse says, “Ye shall observe to do therefore as the Lord your God hath commanded you: ye shall not turn aside to the right hand or to the left?”
(Deuteronomy 5:32)

- a) To what group did Jesus give “power and authority over all devils, and to cure diseases?” (To “his twelve disciples, vs. 1)
- b) What person was “perplexed” because some were saying that John the Baptizer was risen from the dead, etc.? (Herod, vs. 7)
- c) What had Herod done to John the Baptizer or Immerser? (Herod had executed him by beheading him, vs. 9)
- d) What did Jesus speak to the people regarding, according to Luke 9:11? (He “spoke unto them of the kingdom of God)
- e) What verse reminds us of the limited nature of time with the phrase “And when the day began to wear away...?” (Luke 9:12)
- f) How many loaves and how many fishes did Jesus use in the miracle of feeding the five-thousand? (Five loaves and two fishes, vs. 16)
- g) Luke 9:23 reads, “...If any man will come after Me, let him _____ himself, and take up his cross _____, and follow Me.” (deny; daily)
- h) According to Luke 9:28 what did Jesus go “up into a mountain” to do? (To pray)
- i) Was Jesus able to cast out the unclean spirit that His disciples were not able to cast out? (Yes, vs. 42)
- j) What two disciples of Jesus wanted to call down fire from heaven after the order of Elijah? (James and John, vs. 54)

1) Deuteronomy 6 – Read & Answer Below

- a) Were they commanded by God, in the Old Testament, to “love the Lord thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might?” (Yes, vs. 5)
- b) What verses make the necessity of teaching children abundantly clear? (Deuteronomy 6:2, 7, 20)
- c) What three verses specifically mention the land promise that was given to Abraham and reiterated to Isaac and Jacob? (Deuteronomy 6:10, 18, 23)
- d) In Deuteronomy 6:12, the people are warned about what? (The sin of forgetting! God said, “Then beware lest thou forget the Lord...”)
- e) What verse specifically warns them about not going after “other gods, of the the gods of the people” which would be “round about” them? (Deuteronomy 6:14)
- f) What type of hand does the text say God used in bringing Israel out of Egypt? (A mighty hand, vs. 21)
- g) Deuteronomy 6:24 declares, “And the Lord commanded us to _____ all these statutes, to _____ the Lord our God, for our _____ always, that He might preserve us alive, as it is at this day.” (do; fear; good)

2) Luke 9 – Read & Word Study/Research

- a) Comparing Luke 9:2 with Luke 9:6, we find that “preaching the gospel” also involves preaching “the _____ of God.” (kingdom)

- b) How many men did Jesus miraculously feed in the desert (i.e., desolate) place? (Five thousand, vs. 14)
- c) How many left over baskets remained after the miraculous feeding by Jesus? (Twelve baskets, vs. 17)
- d) Luke 9:22 reads, "...The Son of man must _____ many things, and be rejected of the _____ and _____ priests and scribes, and be _____, and be raised the _____ day." (suffer; elders; chief; slain; third)
- e) What verse shows Jesus saying that some in his day would not die (i.e., "taste of death") until they were able to "see the kingdom of God?" (Luke 9:27)
- f) What two Old Testament greats were with Jesus on the mount of transfiguration? (Moses and Elias (i.e., Elijah), vs. 30)
- g) What verse says, "Then there arose a reasoning among them, which of them should be greatest?" (Luke 9:46)
- h) What verse says, "For the Son of man is not come to destroy men's lives, but to save them?" (Luke 9:56)
- i) Luke 9:62 reads, "...No man, having put his hand to the _____, and looking _____, is fit for the _____ of God." (plough; back; kingdom)

5. Thursday –

1) Deuteronomy 7 – Read & Answer Below

- a) How many nations did God say they were to "cast out" in their conquest of the land of Canaan? (Seven nations, vs. 1)
- b) Deuteronomy 7:2 clearly says that Israel was to "utterly _____ them" and was to "make no covenant with them, nor shew _____ unto them." (destroy; mercy)
- c) Why was Israel commanded to NOT make marriages with the inhabitants of Canaan? (Because God said that "they will turn away thy son from following Me, that they may serve other gods...., vs. 4)
- d) What verse says that the Israelites were to be "an holy people" and "a special people?" (Deuteronomy 7:6)
- e) What verse says that God brought them out of Egypt and would give them Canaan because "He would keep the oath which He had sworn unto [their] fathers?" (Deuteronomy 7:8)
- f) Did God declare that He would "take away" from them "all sickness" and would "put none of the evil diseases of Egypt...upon [them]" if they would obey Him? (Yes, vs. 15. Note, over and over again, how the promises and blessings of God are conditional. Notice the terms like "if" and "then" and "but," etc.)
- g) Were the Israelites to have pity upon the wicked inhabitants of Canaan? (No, vs. 16)
- h) What verse makes it clear that the conquest was to be "by little and little" and that they were to "not consume them at once, lest the beasts of the field increase...?" (Deuteronomy 7:22; However, as vs. 23 shows, they were to utterly destroy them. As this verse says, God through Israel would "destroy them with a mighty destruction, until they be destroyed." Also, compare vs. 24.)
- i) Were they allowed to keep the silver and gold from the Canaanites idols? (No, vs. 25-26)

- a) How many years did Israel have to wander in the wilderness? (Forty years, vs. 2)
- b) Did their clothing “wax old” during the years of the wilderness wandering? (No, vs. 4)
- c) Was the land of Canaan referred to as “a good land” or “a bad land?” (A good land, vs. 7, 10)
- d) Deuteronomy 8:11 says, “_____ that thou _____ not the Lord thy God, in _____ keeping His commandments, and His judgments, and His statutes....” (Beware; forget; not)
- e) What verse warns them against allowing their heart to “be lifted up” and also says that they should not “forget the Lord thy God?” (Deuteronomy 8:14)
- f) Deuteronomy 8:16 reads, “...that He might humble thee, and that He might _____ thee, to do thee _____ at thy _____ end.” (prove; good; latter)
- g) Did God promise Israel that He would punish them just as He was punishing Canaan, if they too became rebellious and disobedient? (Absolutely, vs. 19-20)

- c) Luke 10:16 says, “He that _____ you heareth Me; and he that _____ you despiseth Me; and He that despiseth Me despiseth Him that _____ Me.” (heareth; despiseth; sent)
- d) Jesus tells the seventy not to rejoice because “the spirits are subject unto you; but rather rejoice, because your _____ are _____ in _____.” (names; written; heaven, vs. 20)
- e) What verse begins the section regarding the account of the good Samaritan? (Luke 10:25ff)
- f) Which sister was “cumbered about much serving?” (Martha, vs. 40)
- g) Which sister had “chosen that good part,” according to Jesus? (Mary, vs. 42)
